#### Assumptions and objectives of the course:

Understanding the methods of testing the strength of materials and checking the strength of a structure. Mastering basic principles in the field of mechanics and strength analysis. Understanding the theoretical and practical problems related to strength analysis based on the mechanical properties of materials as the basis for the proper design of the structure. Passing in a simple form selected endurance issues, i.e. modeling statically indeterminate systems or solving complexity problems. Indication of limitations necessary in constructing due to safety and reliability, regulations, standards. Indication of the areas of acceptable solutions and effective solutions to the problem. Awareness of the complexity of construction: the need to build and test prototypes, formulate the conditions for safe operation, the need for a systematic approach to problems.

#### **Course description**

Basic concepts from statics. Definition of strength, division of forces, systems of forces. Ties and reactions of bonds. Internal forces. One-axis state of stresses and strains. Stress- strains curve. Hooke's law. The conditions of the equilibrium of flat systems of forces. Statically determinate and indeterminable rod systems and rod-beam systems. Shear stresses, deformations. Generalized Hooke's law. Permissible stresses, safety factor of the structure and strength condition. Hypothesis of material effort. Moments of inertia of flat figures, center of gravity of the cross-section, main central axes of inertia. Steiner's theorem.
