Prerequisites

The already acquired language competence compatible with level B2+ (CEFR). The ability to use general and field specific vocabulary, and grammatical structures required on the second cycle of studies. The ability to work individually and in a group; the ability to use various sources of information and reference works.

# **Course objective**

1. Advancing students' language competence towards the level at least C1(CEFR).

2. Development of the ability to use academic and field specific language effectively in both receptive and productive language skills.

3. Improving the ability to understand field specific texts (familiarizing students with basic translation techniques).

4. Improving the ability to function effectively on an international market and on a daily basis.



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### **Course-related learning outcomes**

Knowledge

1. The student knows learning methods and techniques.

2. The student knows and uses a wide range of general English vocabulary and specific vocabulary in writing and in speaking.

3. The student has knowledge about writing paragraphs, summaries and abstracts.

#### Skills

1. The student can give a talk on field specific or popular science topic (in English), and discuss general and field specific issues using an appropriate linguistic and grammatical repertoire.

2. The student can express basic mathematical formulas and interpret data presented on graphs/diagrams.

3. The student can understand and analyze international, field specific literature.

4. The student can analyse the project and organize a business meeting.

#### Social competences

1. As a result of the course, the student is able to communicate effectively in a field specific/professional area in English, and to give a successful presentation in English.

2. The student is able to recognize and understand cultural differences in a professional and private conversation in English, and in a different cultural environment.

#### Methods for verifying learning outcomes and assessment criteria

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

Formative assessment: knowledge is checked by two written assignements and student's activity/ activities during tutorials.

Summative assessment: final credit: a written test on topics presented on Moodle platform. The required level: 60%.

### **Programme content**

Developing general and specific English vocabulary.Providing samples of academic writing and appropriate practice material to enable students to express themselves coherently in writing (writing reports, summaries). Developing listening and speaking skills. Business correspondence in intercultural setting. Grammar and vocabulary preparation in order to write master thesis in English.
