Programme content

Introduction of basic specialist vocabulary from the field of interior design covering the following topics: history of interior design, elements of interior design, design of interiors by means of professional texts.

Description of an interior with the use of all the specialist vocabulary covered in class.

Introduction of vocabulary from the area of maths and geometry as well as graphs and diagrams interpretation and description.

Revision and consolidation of general vocabulary and grammar rules.

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Students' presentations connected with the field of study.
