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Prerequisites

The student should have basic knowledge on the state system at the level of secondary school graduation, the ability to think logically and practical skills in the search for basic literature available in print and in the Internet, as well as understand the importance of legal and institutional regulatory mechanisms in social life and the economy.

Course objective

Providing students with general information on the legal system and branches of law, with particular emphasis on concluding civil law contracts.

Course-related learning outcomes

Knowledge:

- 1. The student has knowledge of the national legal system and its internal structure (branches of law), institutions and sources of EU law and their mutual relations [K1 W05].
- 2. The student knows the rules of performing legal actions, including the premises of their validity and the consequences of failure to comply with them; knows the basic methods of concluding contracts in economic trade; (s)he knows the institution of power of attorney [K1 W05].

3. The student knows the basic issues and institutions of intellectual property law [K1 W12].

Skills:

- 1. The student is able to properly select the sources of law and information derived from them, to evaluate, critically analyze and synthesize this information [K1 U01].
- 2. The student is able to take part in the debate, to present, by means of appropriately selected means, the problem falling within the legal aspects of the actions taken [K1 U09].
- 3. The student is able to identify changes in the requirements, standards, regulations and technical progress and the reality of the labor market, and on their basis determine the need for supplementing legal knowledge [K1_U12].

Social competences:

- 1. The student is able to see the cause-and-effect relationships in the implementation of the set goals and use the ranks in relation to the significance of alternative or competitive tasks in the context of the legal aspects of the activities undertaken [K1_K01].
- 2. The student is aware of the importance of knowledge in solving legal problems and continuous improvement [K1 K02].
- 3. The student is aware of behaving in a professional manner, observing the rules of professional ethics and respecting the diversity of views and cultures [K1 K06.]

Methods for verifying learning outcomes and assessment criteria

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

Formative assessment: ongoing activity during classes and participation in the discussion; solving legal problems during the classes that offers the opportunity to assess the student's understanding of the issues raised.

Summative assessment: two written tests conducted separately for tutorials and lectures, consisting of multiple-choice questions and open questions; passing threshold: approx. 55% of points.
