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Prerequisites

The student should have basic knowledge on the state system at the level of secondary school graduation as well as understand the importance of legal and institutional regulatory mechanisms in social life and the economy.

Course objective

Acquiring knowledge and skills essential for conducting business activity.

Course-related learning outcomes

Knowledge:

The student has knowledge on legal norms, their sources, changes and ways of influencing organizations, with particular emphasis on business law.

The student is able to characterize the organizational and legal forms of running businesses.

The student knows the rules of establishing and conducting various forms of economic activity; has knowledge on relationships between legal and management aspects resulting from it.

Skills:

The student applies the basic concepts of civil law.

The student has the ability to understand and analyze social phenomena from the point of view of applicable law.

The student applies legal provisions to business practice; applies legal norms to specific problems and puts forward the relevant proposals to solve them.

Social competences:

The student is aware of the importance of professional behavior and compliance with legal norms in business transactions.

The student knowingly applies various legal institutions.

Methods for verifying learning outcomes and assessment criteria

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

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Formative assessment: discussions summarizing particular lectures, solving legal problems during the classes that offers the opportunity to assess the student's understanding of the issues raised.

Summative assesment: the knowledge acquired in tutorials is verified in a written test carried out in the last class. Passing threshold is above 50% of points.

Programme content

Economic activity - the concept, rules for establishing and running economic activity. The concept of an entrepreneur and a consumer. Organisational and legal forms of entrepreneurs. Self-employment. Civil law partnership. Commercial partnerships and capital companies. Procuration. National Court Register.
