### Prerequisites

Polish as a foreign language for complete beginners in Polish. The course is designed for students starting their adventure with a new language, knowledge of Polish is not required.

### Course objective

The aim of the course is to learn the basics of communication in Polish while studying in Poland. The emphasis is on practical knowledge of the language and communication as well as learning about Polish culture. After completing the course the student should be able to pass a Polish language exam at level A1.

### Course-related learning outcomes

Knowledge:

Students are slowly acquiring knowledge about the pronunciation of the Polish language, the basic vocabulary of everyday life and the basics of Polish grammar. In addition, they absorb news about Polish culture and customs, this knowledge allows them to feel better in our country.

Skills:

Students are able to communicate in simple everyday activities. They know how to introduce

themselves, ask a simple question and answer it. They know the basic terms of politeness, are able to express an uncomplicated request, wish, ask for help. They understand the content of topics related to typical issues at the university and dormitory, etc.

They can easily tell about themselves, their interests, free time and family. They know how to handle various situations when traveling around Poland.

Social competences:

Students are aware that communication in Polish is very useful during their stay in Poland. They also know that to achieve success they must learn systematically and constantly apply new skills in practice. They become aware of cultural differences.

### Methods for verifying learning outcomes and assessment criteria

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

SEMESTER I:

Knowledge verification takes place throughout the whole course. It consists of: quizzes, tests, homework exercises and speaking exercises.

passing rate from 60%.

SEMESTER II:

Knowledge verification takes place throughout the whole course. It consists of: quizzes, tests, speaking exercises, homework exercises and presentations.

passing rate from 60%.

EXAM after two semesters of language learning.

The exam consists of a written and oral part.

The written part is a two-hour test (listening, reading, writing, vocabulary and grammar exercises).

The oral part is a self-presentation and a description of a randomly drawn picture.

passing rate from 50%.

### Programme content

Students learn basic phrases and expressions related to everyday life activities.

They acquire knowledge of Polish pronunciation and basic grammatical structures. They develop communication skills. They learn about Polish history and culture.

### Course topics

1. University life
2. Hobbies, expressing preferences
3. Expressing time relations
4. Names of food, dishes and drinks (ordering in cafes and restaurants)
5. Asking for information and permission
6. Jobs and activities.
7. Physical appearance and features of character - description.
8. Expressing ability and opportunity
9. Everyday routine
10. Days of the week, telling the time.

### Teaching methods

SEMESTER I + SEMESTER II:

Students carry out a program based on selected chapters from the primary and secondary literature and additional materials supplied by the teacher. Numerous and varied exercises systematically develop the 4 skills: speaking, writing, reading and listening. They also use presentations and language learning materials from the internet. They analyze the source material presented by the teacher, work individually, in pairs and groups. There are audio materials for each lesson.
