Prerequisites

Polish as a foreign language for beginners in Polish. The course is designed for learning general Polish at the beginner level under the teacher's guidance. Knowledge of Polish is not required.

Course objective

The aim of the course is to learn the basics of communication in Polish while studying in Poland. The emphasis is on practical knowledge of the language and communication as well as learning about Polish culture. After completing the course the student should be able to pass the Polish language exam at level A1.

Methods for verifying learning outcomes and assessment criteria

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

Knowledge verification takes place throughout the whole course. It consists of: quizzes, tests, homework

exercises and speaking exercises.
Passing threshold: 60% of points.

Programme content

Students learn basic phrases and expressions related to everyday life activities. They acquire knowledge of Polish pronunciation and basic grammatical structures. They develop communication skills. They learn about Polish history and culture.

1. Making contact
2. Welcome and farewell formulas
3. Introducing yourself
4. Question about well-being and expressing well-being
5. Numbers 1-100
6. Asking questions
7. Determining the characteristics of people (description of appearance and character)
8. Nationalities
9. Professions and activities
10. Age
11. Family
12. Personal relations

Teaching methods

Students perform the syllabus based on selected chapters from the primary and secondary literature and additional materials supplied by the teacher. Numerous and varied exercises systematically develop the 4 skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing. They also use presentations and language learning materials from the Internet. They analyse the source material presented by the teacher, work individually, in pairs and groups. There are audio materials for each lesson.
