Prerequisites

The student has basic knowledge necessary to understand social and legal conditions for conducting engineering activities. The student has the ability to use the indicated sources and interpret social phenomena. The student understands the need to expand his/her competences in the social sciences.

Course objective

Providing students with knowledge and skills in the legal aspects of running a business.

Course-related learning outcomes

Knowledge:

Characterizes basic concepts of business law, including the definition of business activity, entrepreneurs, and consumers [DSB1_W06].

Describes organizational and legal forms of enterprises, including civil and commercial companies, and the principles of their functioning [DSB1_W08].

Explains mechanisms for creditor protection, liability for damages, and procedures related to debtor insolvency [DSB1_W09].

Skills:

Analyzes systemic and non-technical aspects of business law, including regulations related to business registration and forms of legal actions [DSB1_U06].

Conducts a critical analysis and evaluation of the functioning of enterprises in light of legal regulations [DSB1_U07].

Argues legal issues related to business activity, including the principles of contract formation and creditor interest protection [DSB1_U11].

Social competences:

Critically analyzes their own knowledge and skills in business law and strives for continuous updates [DSB1_K01].

Takes responsibility for legal decisions made in the context of conducting business activities [DSB1_K05].

Methods for verifying learning outcomes and assessment criteria

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

Formative assessment: discussions summarizing each lecture and tutorial; solving specific legal problems during classes, giving the opportunity to assess the student's understanding of the issues.

Summative assessment: Tutorials: written test which consists of 10 questions (7 test questions for 1 point + 1 open question for 3 points). The passing threshold is 6 points. Lectures: a written exam which consists of 3 open questions; each question for 3 points. The passing threshold is 5 points.

Programme content

To familiarize the student with the basic institutions and problems of economic law, in particular with the principles as well as organizational and legal forms of running a business.

Course topics

Lectures:

The notion of an economic activity, an entrepreneur and a consumer. Principles of conducting business activity. Organizational and legal forms of enterprises. An individual as an entrepreneur. Civil partnership. Commercial companies: partnerships and capital companies. Commercial proxy (procurator). Registers of entrepreneurs: CEIDG and the National Court Register.

Tutorials:

Forms of legal actions. Practical discussion of contracts. Ordinary and registered pledge. Liability for damages and its conditions (tort and contractual liability). Creditor protection in the event of debtor's insolvency (Paulian Action).

Teaching methods

informative, problem-based, conversational lecture using a multimedia presentation
case method (solving cases in the field of labor law), presentations, discussion
