## **Prerequisites**

The already acquired language competence compatible with level B1 (CEFR). The ability to use vocabulary and grammatical structures required on the high school graduation exam with regard to productive and receptive skills. The ability to work individually and in a group; the ability to use various sources of information and reference works.

### Course objective

Advancing students language competence towards at least level B2 (CEFR). Development of the ability to use academic and field specific language effectively in both receptive and productive language skills. Improving the ability to understand field specific texts (familiarizing students with basic translation techniques). Improving the ability to function effectively on an international market and on a daily basis.

## Course-related learning outcomes

### Knowledge:

As a result of the course, the student ought to acquire field specific vocabulary related to the following issues: mathematics and geometry, describing diagrams and graphs, environmental protection, energy. The student is able to define and explain associated terms, phenomena and processes.

### Skills:

- 1. As a result of the course, the student is able to give a talk on field specific or popular science topic (in German).
- 2. The student is able to express basic mathematical formulas and to interpret data presented on graphs/diagrams.
- 3. The student is able to discuss general and field specific issues using an appropriate linguistic and grammatical repertoire.
- 4. The student is able to formulate a text in German where he/she explains/describes a selected field specific topic.

### Social competences:

- 1. As a result of the course, the student is able to communicate effectively in a field specific/professional area, and to give a successful presentation in German.
- 2. The student is able to recognize and understand cultural differences in a professional and private conversation, and in a different cultural environment.

# Methods for verifying learning outcomes and assessment criteria

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

Formative assessment: tests during academic year (written and oral, MT) presentations. Summative assessment: credit. To obtain a positive assessment the student is obliged to pass the material covered by the program with at least 50%.
