3. Online catalogue of the PUT Library.
4. Principles of sharing library collections outside.
5. Principles of sharing books, journals, standards and other library materials available on site.
6. Principles of working interlibrary orders.
7. Services offered by the PUT Library: group study rooms and stands, cabins for individual work, laptops and tablets on demand, stands for students with disabilities.
