Prerequisites

The student should have basic knowledge of the functioning of the state system and the law; the ability for multi-vector and critical analysis; should have basic knowledge of legal and institutional mechanisms regulating social and economic life.

Course objective

Providing students with basic information on the legal system and branches of law, with particular emphasis on civil and commercial law.

Course-related learning outcomes

Knowledge:

1. Student has basic knowledge about the law and its internal structure (branch of law) [P6S_WG_08]
2. Student has basic knowledge about selected legal institutions within the branch of law [P6S_WG_08]
3. Student has expanded knowledge of civil (substantive) law and commercial law [P6S_WG_08]

Skills:

1. Student is able to understand and use legal language in the basic range, interpret legal phenomena

Methods for verifying learning outcomes and assessment criteria

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

Lecture

Knowledge is assessed on the basis of source materials made available to students on the eKursy platform (multimedia presentation), together with supplementary problem-based materials (articles and examples from the tutorials).

Assessment is based on two tests:

Mid-term test, held halfway through the course, consisting of 10 single-choice questions.

Final test, consisting of 20 questions in total – 15 multiple-choice and 5 open-ended.

Students who take the mid-term test and achieve a positive result receive an additional 1 point towards the final test.

Grading scale (lecture):

19–20 points = 5.0

17–18 points = 4.5

15–16 points = 4.0

13–14 points = 3.5

11–12 points = 3.0

10 points = 2.0

Tutorials

Knowledge is assessed on the basis of materials covered during the tutorials, as well as sources provided for independent study. During tutorials, students learn how to read and conclude contracts, and to understand the consequences arising from contractual provisions and their own actions.

Credit is awarded on the basis of the student's work during tutorials, as well as a mid-term test (10 multiple-choice questions) and a final test (20 single-choice questions).

Students who participate actively in tutorials may be exempted from the final tutorial test on the basis of submitted in-class assignments.

Grades are not awarded for the mid-term test. Passing the mid-term test results in an additional 1 point being added to the final test score for the tutorials.

Grading scale (tutorials – combined result of both tests):

19–20 points = 5.0

17–18 points = 4.5

15–16 points = 4.0

13–14 points = 3.5

11–12 points = 3.0

10 points = 2.0

Programme content

Lecture: Introduction to jurisprudence: law as a system of standards; the concept of a legal norm and a legal regulation; legal systems; types of law; sources of law; national law and international law - the legal system of the European Union; basic constitutional principles of law; justice in Poland. Civil law: general characteristics: systematic; structure, scope; basic principles of civil law: the principle of social coexistence, non-retroactivity, abuse of law; the concept of onus probandi; presumption; good faith; subjects of a civil law relationship: a natural person, a legal person and an organizational unit without legal personality to which the law assigns legal capacity. Economic law: general characteristics; the concept of entrepreneur and enterprise; economic activity; business concept; the concept of a consumer - civil law and economic law; commercial law companies: personal and capital. Criminal law: concept and basic principles; the misdemeanor and the crime; hallmarks of a crime; rules of criminal liability. Administrative law: government and local government administration; forms of operation of public administration; the judiciary. Labor law: basic principles of labor law; types of employment contracts.

Tutorials: Principles and forms of contracting; sales contract (warranty, guarantee); lease agreement; lease agreement; managerial contract; easements (land, personal, transmission); transmission easement agreement; leasing agreement; order; agency contract; contract of carriage (carriage of passengers, carriage of goods); forwarding contract; the storage contract; surety; forms of business registration: civil law partnership and civil law companies: general partnership, limited partnership, limited joint-stock partnership, limited liability company.

Teaching methods

Lecture: an informative lecture with problematic elements conducted with the use of a multimedia presentation, supplemented with examples; a lecture supplemented with materials for self-study in the eKursy system; introducing a new topic preceded by a reminder of related content, known to students from other previous lectures.

Tutorials: introduction to the issues based on a multimedia presentation constituting the basis for the analysis of didactic materials made available to students on eCourses, using the S24 platform; problematic analysis of contracts made available to students on the eCourses platform; contract construction; ways of registering a business based on formal registration applications and based on the use of government platforms; preparation of court documents.
